They sell a variety of continence related products including bedding/mattress protection, Specialist bedding (duvets, mattresses and pillows), Bedside or bed mat alarm, Mini or body-worn alarm, Swimwear, Absorbent pants or Vibrating watches.



#### Toilet Time - www.eric.org.uk or www.sensetoys.com

A 10-page laminated wipe-clean flip book containing velcro-backed pictures of children toilet training. These provide a visual sequence for the stages of toileting. Also sell the symbols individually.



#### Squatty Potty – www.squattypotty.co.uk

Fits around the bottom of a toilet and enables you to sit in a squatting position.



## Portable bidet – amazon or <u>www.fledgings.org.uk</u>

A strong plastic bowel which fits onto most toilet bowls, under the seat, to create a bidet. Can be useful to lay a nappy on if trying to teach children to poo without their nappy.



## Portable urinals – amazon or www.fledglings.org.uk

Can be used by girls or boys, sealed lid minimises odours and spilling, the size of a can, it expands when necessary with a capacity of 750ml.



#### Droplet – www.droplet-hydration.com or amazon

A cup and a mug that reminds you to drink. You can use the prerecorded messages or record your own, and set the frequency of the reminders.

# **Practical support**

#### Accessible toilets - RADAR key

The National Key Scheme offers disabled people independent access to almost 9,000 locked public toilets around the country. Costs £4.50 from Disability Rights UK or R.A.D.A.R. Key Company. Keys can be purchased by to people who require use of the toilet facilities due to their disability or health condition.
