I would consider recommending this school if the child's needs are very high regarding autism. Keep contact as immediate as possible when there has been an incident at school.

I'm not sure that your questions are always helpful. What does "well behaved" mean for autistic young people? What is "doing well" for them? "High expectations" seems a particularly problematic concept. These children clearly will not meet conventionally high expectations, so what is this stock phrase supposed to mean here? If you really want to know what parents think, and this is a laudable wish, then gather some for an in-depth qualitative assessment. This sort of skin-deep, quantitative questionnaire is pretty meaningless really.

No afterschool clubs in this school that every child in mainstream school can attend. School day is already shorter than all mainstream secondary schools, so his life experiences, participation is less and is valued as less.
