Drumming Sessions

Sessions were provided for all students at Durants for 3 half terms for one morning per week. This enabled pupils to learn rhythm, beat as well as working as part of a group. Pupils also enjoyed this activity. All pupil premium pupils accessed these sessions.

Arts Award

The Arts Award enriches the curriculum by offering creative studies that support on-going progress in more academic subjects. This money supported the purchase of materials and official registration and accreditation. 20 pupils in receipt of pupil premium benefitted from this initiative.

TLR – Music

The music co-ordinator has facilitated the music aspect of the arts award as well as liaising with the drumming group and local music service to provide music tuition for pupils across Durants. This person also organised the school's participation in the borough music and dance festivals. 30 pupils in receipt of the pupil premium accessed these sessions.

TLR – Art

The art co-ordinator has facilitated the art aspect of the arts award. 20 pupils in receipt of the pupil premium accessed these sessions.

Music Therapist

The music therapist provided sessions to pupils identified in the school as requiring either group or individual therapy sessions. The first half term the therapist worked with the therapy team to assess and prioritise all pupils new to the school who might need some sort of therapy and then to agree which therapy would best suit the individual. 20 pupils accessed these sessions that were in receipt of the pupil premium.

Occupational Therapy

The Occupational Therapist worked with the therapy team to assess all year 7 pupils and agree which therapeutic input pupils might require. The OT also worked with pupils individually as well as in small groups. In addition the OT demonstrated programmes to staff to enable them to carry out programmes with pupils throughout the week as part of their timetable. 20 pupils that were in receipt of the pupil premium accessed OT.

Family Support Adviser

The Family Support Adviser works across the school. As well as providing general support sessions including coffee mornings on the Local Offer and the therapies she has also provided more targeted support to families. These have included home visits to new pupils and targeted support to families requiring more sustained support. 30 families in receipt of pupil premium have benefitted from this support.

Overall 0 pupils in receipt of the pupil premium are making below expected progress. Overall pupils making less than expected progress did so in certain subjects but not in all areas. Our data shows that whilst our pupils on pupil premium do equally as well as pupil not on FSM in not being below expected progress we need to look at aspiring for more pupils on the pupil premium to make better than expected progress.
